WHEREAS, the Mercer County Board of Chosen Freeholders supports proposed New Jersey bills A2448 and 1081 to allow public high schools in the same district facing low participation numbers to merge teams preventing the cancellation of sport seasons; and,

WHEREAS, under the current rules of the New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association (NJSIAA), schools are prohibited from entering into cooperative sports programs for basketball, baseball, softball and spring track, and in football if one of the schools is classified as a Group III school; and,

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WHEREAS, these bills will require the NJSIAA to allow public high schools in the same school district to enter into a cooperative sports program for any sport at the varsity level if either of the schools demonstrates an inability to field a team at the varsity level due to: a decline in interest or participation in the sport at one of the schools that impacts the ability of that school to safely field a team; or budgetary constraints which force the elimination of certain sports programs at one of the schools; and,

WHEREAS, the NJSIAA will be required to allow the schools to enter into cooperative sports programs regardless of the sport or the member schools' Group classification; and,

WHEREAS, the purpose of this bill is to ensure that all students within a school district have equal access to certain extracurricular programs regardless of which school in the district they attend; and,

WHEREAS, this legislation would prevent scenarios similar to West Windsor-Plainsboro North's forced season cancellation due to overall low student interest; and,

WHEREAS, the West Windsor-Plainsboro school district sought permission from the NJSIAA to merge both the North and South's football team for a period of one-year, but was rejected by the NJSIAA; and,

WHEREAS, the Mercer County Board of Chosen Freeholders recognizes that the creation of super teams by high schools is a possible outcome and urge legislators to include safeguards to prohibit the creation of super teams in the legislature; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that in an effort to grant all students the opportunity to compete in interscholastic athletics, the Mercer County Board of Chosen Freeholders urges the Governor and the New Jersey Legislature to pass and sign into law respectively bills A2448 and S1081 permitting the mergers of teams to prevent the cancellation of sport seasons; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk to the Board shall forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the New Jersey Interscholastic Athletic Association, West Windsor Township, Governor Phil Murphy, the Mercer County Legislative Delegation and Municipal Clerks throughout Mercer County.
