Public Hearing 6 The Mercer County Planning Board and general public are hereby presented with a proposed amendment to the Mercer County Water Quality Management Plan. This amendment proposal, titled õHamilton Holiday Inn Express,ö submitted by Van Cleef Engineering Associates on behalf of the landowner Chandu Patel, would expand the Hamilton Township Water Pollution Control Facility sewer service area (SSA) by 6.36 acres to accommodate the development of a Holiday Inn Express consisting of 84 guest rooms, a 210-seat restaurant, and an indoor pool facility. These proposed developments would take place in Hamilton Township, Mercer County, within Block 2596, Lot 8.
