<u>Section 1.</u> The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the County of Mercer, New Jersey ("County").

<u>Section 2.</u> It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the County from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$64,891,842;
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$61,794,284; and
- (c) a down payment in the amount of \$3,097,559 for a portion of the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is currently available in accordance with the requirements of Section 11 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-11.
- Section 3. The sum of \$61,794,284, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, together with the sum of \$3,097,559, which amount represents the required down payment, are hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").
- Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the County in an amount not to exceed \$61,794,284 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.
- Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the County in an amount not to exceed \$61,794,284 is hereby authorized. Section 8. Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of, obligations issued to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

Section 9. The average period of useful life of the several purposes for the financing of which this Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, taking into consideration the

respective amounts of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for said several purposes is not less than 12.47 years.

- Section 10. The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$61,794,284 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- Section 11. The full faith and credit of the County are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the County shall levy *ad valorem* taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.
- Section 12. The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and available for inspection.
- Section 13. The City hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceed of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code") for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the City prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

Section 14. The County hereby covenants as follows:

- (a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposed, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;
- (b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;
- (c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such terms is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;
- (d) it shall timely file with the Ogden, Utah Service Center of the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and
- (e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

Section 15. The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the County may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Mercer, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

Section 1. The purposes described in Section 7 hereof are hereby authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the County of Mercer, New Jersey ("County").

Section 2. It is hereby found, determined and declared as follows:

- (a) the estimated amount to be raised by the County from all sources for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$6,400,000; and
- (b) the estimated amount of bonds or bond anticipation notes to be issued for the purposes stated in Section 7 hereof is \$6,400,000.
- Section 3. The sum of \$6,400,000, to be raised by the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, is hereby appropriated for the purposes stated in this bond ordinance ("Bond Ordinance").
- Section 4. The issuance of negotiable bonds of the County in an amount not to exceed \$6,400,000 to finance the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 hereof is hereby authorized. Said bonds shall be sold in accordance with the requirements of the Local Bond Law.
- Section 5. In order to temporarily finance the purposes described in Section 7 hereof, the issuance of bond anticipation notes of the County in an amount not to exceed \$6,400,000 is hereby authorized. Pursuant to the Local Bond Law, the County Treasurer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver the same to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their date to delivery thereof. The County Treasurer is hereby directed to report in writing to the Board of Chosen Freeholders at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale

or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this Bond Ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

- Section 6. The amount of the proceeds of the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance which may be used for the payment of interest on such obligations, accounting, engineering, legal fees and other items as provided in Section 20 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-20, shall not exceed the sum of \$1,250,000.
- Section 7. The improvements hereby authorized and the purposes for which said obligations are to be issued; the estimated costs of each said purpose; the amount of down payment for each said purpose; the maximum

amount obligations to be issued for each said purpose and the period of usefulness of each said purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law are as follows:

The average period of useful life of the several purposes for the financing of which this Bond Ordinance authorizes the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes, taking into consideration the respective amounts of bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized for said several purposes is not less than 15.69 years.

Section 9. Grants or other monies received from any governmental entity, if any, will be applied to the payment of, or repayment of obligations issued to finance, the costs of the purposes described in Section 7 above.

Section 10. The supplemental debt statement provided for in Section 10 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-10, was duly filed in the office of the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders prior to the passage of this Bond Ordinance on first reading and a complete executed duplicate original thereof has been filed in the Office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. The supplemental debt statement shows that the gross debt of the County, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:2-43, is increased by this Bond Ordinance by \$6,400,000 and that the obligations authorized by this Bond Ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 11. The full faith and credit of the County are irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance, and to the extent payment is not otherwise provided, the County shall levy ad valorem taxes on all taxable real property without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment thereof.

Section 12. The Capital Budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this Bond Ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith, and the resolution promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended Capital Budget and Capital Program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders and available for inspection.

Section 13. The County hereby declares its intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance pursuant to Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(e), promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("Code"), for "original expenditures", as defined in Income Tax Regulation Section 1.150-2(c)(2), made by the County prior to the issuance of such bonds or bond anticipation notes.

Section 14. The County hereby covenants as follows:

- (a) it shall take all actions necessary to ensure that the interest paid on the bonds or bond anticipation notes authorized by this Bond Ordinance is exempt from the gross income of the owners thereof for federal income taxation purposes, and will not become a specific item of tax preference pursuant to Section 57(a)(5) of the Code;
- (b) it will not make any use of the proceeds of the bonds or bond anticipation notes or do or suffer any other action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "arbitrage bonds" as such term is defined in Section 148(a) of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder;

- (c) it shall calculate or cause to be calculated and pay, when due, the rebatable arbitrage with respect to the "gross proceeds" (as such term is used in Section 148(f) of the Code) of the bonds or bond anticipation notes;
- (d) it shall timely file with the Internal Revenue Service, such information report or reports as may be required by Sections 148(f) and 149(e) of the Code; and
- (e) it shall take no action that would cause the bonds or bond anticipation notes to be "federally guaranteed" within the meaning of Section 149(b) of the Code.

Section 15. The improvements authorized hereby are not current expenses and are improvements that the County may lawfully make. No part of the cost of the improvements authorized hereby has been or shall be specially assessed on any property specially benefited thereby.

Section 16. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 17. In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this Bond Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

BACKGROUND

WHEREAS, The Mercer County Improvement Authority ("Authority") has been duly created by resolution of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Mercer, New Jersey ("County") as a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey ("State") pursuant to and in accordance with the County Improvement Authorities Act, constituting Chapter 183 of the Pamphlet Laws of 1960 of the State, and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto (N.J.S.A. 40:37A-44 et seq.) ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Authority is authorized, pursuant to the Act, to provide financing for the provision of public facilities (as defined in the Act), including capital equipment and infrastructure improvements and facilities, for use by local government units, including the County, for use in their governmental purposes; and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2005, the Authority issued \$27,660,000 aggregate principal amount of its County of Mercer General Obligation Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2005A (County Equipment and Improvements Project) ("2005 Bonds") for the purpose of financing the cost of the acquisition and installation of certain items of capital equipment and the construction and reconstruction of certain infrastructure improvements and facilities and the leasing thereof to the County (collectively, the "2005 County Lease Financing Program"), pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Authority on May 10, 2005, entitled, "Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of County of Mercer General Obligation Lease Revenue Bonds, Series 2005A (County Equipment and Improvements Project) and Additional Bonds of The Mercer County Improvement Authority", as the same may be amended, modified or supplemented in accordance with the provisions thereof ("General Bond Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, in connection with the 2005 County Lease Financing Program, the County entered into a Lease Purchase Agreement, dated as of June 1, 2005, by and between the Authority and the County ("Lease Agreement"), to finance the acquisition of various equipment and the construction of various infrastructure improvements, as described in Schedule "A" to the Lease Agreement and Ordinance 2004-9, duly and finally adopted by the County on September 9, 2004 ("Lease Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Lease Agreement, the County agreed to make Basic Lease Payments (as such term is defined in each of the General Bond Resolution) in an amount equal to the debt service paid by the Authority on the 2005 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Lease Agreement, the County's obligation to make Lease Payments (as defined in the Lease Agreement), as the same shall be come due and payable, is absolute and unconditional and constitutes a general obligation of the County and, if not paid from other sources, the County shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all taxable property within the jurisdiction of the County without limitation as to rate or amount for the payment of the Lease Payments; and

WHEREAS, due to current market conditions and in order to achieve debt service savings which will reduce the outstanding Basic Lease Payment obligations of the County, the Authority intends to authorize the issuance of its County of Mercer General Obligation Lease Revenue Refunding Bonds (County Equipment and Improvements Project), Series 2019, in an aggregate principal amount not-to-exceed \$16,100,000 ("2019 Bonds"), pursuant to the terms of a supplemental bond resolution to be adopted by the Authority ("First Supplemental Resolution"; together with the General Bond Resolution, the "Bond Resolution"), the proceeds of which will be used to refund all or a portion of the callable maturities of the Authority's \$15,505,000 aggregate principal amount of outstanding 2005 Bonds maturing serially on August 1 in the years 2019 through and including 2025 and the outstanding term 2005 Bonds maturing on August 1, 2030 and August 1, 2035; and

WHEREAS, debt service on the 2019 Bonds will be secured by Basic Lease Payments to be made by the County pursuant to a First Amendment to Lease Purchase Agreement ("Lease Amendment"; together with the Lease Agreement, the "Lease"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OF THE COUNTY OF MERCER, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to Section 78 of the County Improvement Authorities Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40:37A-44 *et seq.*, the County is hereby authorized and directed to enter into and perform its respective duties under the Lease Amendment, which provides for the continued leasing of the Equipment and the Improvements (each as defined in the Lease Agreement) acquired or constructed with a portion of the proceeds of the 2005 Bonds.

Section 2. The County Executive and the County Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer (each an "Authorized Officer" and, collectively, the "Authorized Officers") are each hereby authorized and directed to execute, on behalf of the County, the Lease Amendment in the form prepared by bond counsel to the Authority, with such additions, deletions or modifications as such officer shall approve, and the Clerk of the Board of Freeholders of the County is hereby authorized and directed to attest to such signature and to affix the seal of the County thereto, and to deliver said Lease Amendment to the Authority, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

Section 3. The full faith and credit of the County are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the obligations set forth in the Lease authorized by this ordinance including, without limitation: (i) all Lease Payment obligations of the County under the Lease including Basic Lease Payments and Additional Lease Payments (as defined in the Lease Agreement); and (ii) all direct and indirect costs of the Authority and the County related to the enforcement of the Lease (collectively, the "Lease Payment Obligation"). The Lease Payment Obligation under the Lease shall be a direct, unlimited and general obligation of the County, not subject to annual appropriation by the County pursuant to the Act and, unless paid from other sources, the County shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the jurisdiction of the County for the payment of the Lease Payment Obligation thereunder without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (1) The maximum Lease Payment Obligation for which the County shall be obligated hereunder, which, *inter alia*, will be used for the payment of principal of and interest on the 2019 Bonds of the Authority shall not exceed \$16,100,000, together with interest thereon.
- (2) The payment authorized herein shall remain effective until all the 2019 Bonds shall have been paid in full in accordance with their terms and/or when all obligations of the County under the Lease have been satisfied, notwithstanding the occurrence of any other event including, but not limited to, the termination of the Lease with respect to some or all of the Equipment and/or Improvements.
- (3) The Improvements and Equipment described in Exhibit "A" of the Lease Agreement and the Lease Ordinance, are hereby approved to continue to be leased from the Authority in accordance with the terms of the Lease, with such further changes, amendments or modifications as may be approved by counsel or bond counsel to the Authority.
- Section 5. The County hereby agrees to comply with the requirements of Rule 15c2-12 ("Rule") promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended and supplemented, including the secondary market disclosure requirements contained therein, and agrees to covenant to such compliance in the Lease Amendment. The Authorized Officers are each hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver a Continuing Disclosure Agreement, approve and "deem final" the Official Statement of the Authority and the preliminary form thereof to the extent the information contained therein relates to the County and to execute and deliver all certificates, documents and agreements to the Authority in connection therewith and to file budgetary, financial and operating data of the County on an annual basis and notices of certain enumerated events as required to comply with and in accordance with the provisions of the Rule.
- Section 6. All ordinances and provisions thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.
- <u>Section 7.</u> Upon the payment of all amounts referenced in Section 4 herein, the full faith and credit pledge of the County as to its Lease Payment Obligation authorized herein shall cease to exist.

- Section 8. The Clerk of the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County shall forward a certified copy of this ordinance, upon final adoption, to the Authority.
- Section 9. The provisions of this ordinance are severable. To the extent any clause, phrase, sentence, paragraph or provision of this ordinance shall be declared invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the remaining provisions shall continue to be in full force and effect.
- Section 10. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after final adoption, publication and approval by the County Executive in accordance with applicable law.
