Recognizing Arbor Day

Whereas, on Jan. 4, 1872, J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

Whereas, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than one million trees in Nebraska; and

Whereas, Arbor Day is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

Whereas, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and

Whereas, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products, and wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal,

Now, Therefore, I, Brian M. Hughes, Mercer County Executive, do hereby recognize April 26, 2019, as Arbor Day, and commend the Mercer County Shade Tree Unit for enriching the lives of Mercer County students and residents.
