The Clerk to the Board announced that in accordance with the provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law, notice of this Informal Meeting had been mailed to The Trenton Times, The Trentonian and The Princeton Packet newspapers as well as having been posted in both the County Administration Building and Courthouse at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the meeting.

PRESENTATION

At this time, Chair Cimino announced that Jason Rogers, Chairperson of Fathers and Men United for a Better Trenton, was in attendance at the meeting to share information about the organization.

Jason Rogers thank the Freeholder Board for their support. He asked for the Freeholder Board's continued support for their upcoming events. (See Schedule A, attached hereto, and made a part hereof)

COMMUNICATIONS

Five (5) communications were discussed and approved for placement on the Agenda for the Formal Meeting of July 18, 2019.

RESOLUTIONS

Fourteen (14) proposed Resolutions were discussed and approved for placement on the agenda for the Formal Meeting of July 18, 2019.

Chair Cimino made reference to the proposed Resolution authorizing to execute a Grant Agreement with Robbinsville Township for the "Mercer at Play 2" Program for the project known as indoor Gymnasium/Multi Use Recreational Facility, and to accept the resulting Deed of Conservation Restriction. He reminded everyone that the Freeholder Meeting would take place in Robbinsville on Thursday evening. He mentioned that the Freeholder Board would present a check to Robbinsville in recognition of the aforementioned program.

He asked the Clerk to the Board to separate the Resolution out for vote because his Engineering Firm does work in Robbinsville.

Freeholder Walter made reference to the proposed Resolution authorizing to execute a Change Order No. 1 and Final with South State Inc. for Water Main Installation at North Quadrant for the Trenton-Mercer Airport. She mentioned that the aforementioned Change Order was the result from the fact that cut-off valves represented in the 1940's drawings did not exist once excavation commenced.

Chair Cimino made reference to the proposed Resolution authorizing to execute an Award of Bid to Marbro Inc. for replacement of Mercer County Bridge No. 330.1 carrying Alexander Street over Stony Brook and County Bridge No. 331.1 carrying Alexander Street over Alexander Creek, Princeton, New Jersey. He suggested that the County make sure communications plans go out because the construction would create a lot of challenges regarding traffic in and out of Princeton.

Freeholder Cannon asked to see an update from the County for upcoming road and bridge closings.

OLD BUSINESS

Freeholder Walter expressed her concerns regarding the lack of events and use of the Cure Arena. She suggested the County invest some money into doing another study as to the use, feasibility and restructuring of the Arena. She mentioned that although there is nothing that can be done to reduce the cost, she believed that something could be done to increase revenue.

Chair Cimino asked the Administration if it would be a study that the Mercer County Improvement Authority (MCIA) would perform, considering their purview. Lillian Nazzaro, Deputy County Administrator, agreed to make the request to the MCIA.

PUBLIC SECTION

At this time, Chair Cimino invited the members of the public to comment on any item listed on and off the agenda.

Anne Chmielewski of Mercer Quiet Sky's, expressed her concerns regarding the endless detours and the property revaluation in Ewing Township. She mentioned her concerns with Trenton Water Works regarding the water quality.

Freeholder Walter asked for an update from the Administration about the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection regulations related to the trees that may potentially be taken down in the Runway Protection Zone.

Freeholder Walter inquired if the County traffic engineers can take a look at the intersection of Mountainview Road and Bear Tavern Road near the gas station and PJ's Pancake House.
