WHEREAS, the Mercer County Executive and the Mercer County Board of Chosen Freeholders have determined to codify and amend in its entirety the Mercer County, New Jersey Administrative Code; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2017-278, adopted on June 22, 2017, Mercer County entered into a Contract with vendor General Code to undertake the necessary modifications for a codified and revised Administrative Code, and to provide on-line availability of the Administrative Code; and,

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the Mercer County government to adopt the codified and revised Administrative Code; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Mercer County Board of Chosen Freeholders as follows:

- 1. The ordinances of Mercer County of a general and permanent nature adopted or approved by Board of Chosen Freeholders, as revised, codified and consolidated into chapters and sections, consisting of Chapters 1.01 through 7.01, together with an Appendix, be and hereby are approved, adopted, ordained and enacted as the "Administrative Code of Mercer County," hereafter known and referred to as the "Administrative Code."
- 2. Each section of the Administrative Code, and every part of each section, is an independent section or part of a section, and the holding of any section or part thereof to be unconstitutional, void or ineffective for any cause shall not be deemed to affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section of parts thereof.
- 3. All ordinances, or parts thereof, inconsistent with the provisions contained in the Administrative Code adopted by this ordinance are hereby repealed; provided, however that such repeal shall only be to the extent of such inconsistency, and any valid legislation of Mercer County which is not in conflict with the provisions of the Administrative Code shall be deemed to remain in full force and effect.
- 4. A. In compiling and preparing the ordinances for adoption and revision as part of the Administrative Code, certain grammatical changes and other minor changes were made in one or more of said ordinances. It is the intention of the Board of Chosen Freeholders that all such changes be adopted as part of the Administrative Code as if the ordinances so changed have been previously formally amended to read as such.

B. Nomenclature. The following changes are made in the Administrative Code:

"Division of Employee Relations" is changed to "Department of Personnel."

- (i) Chapter 3.13 is amended to change instances of "Princeton Borough" and "Princeton Township" to "Princeton", and to change instances of "Washington Township" to "Robbinsville Township".
- (ii) Chapter 3.17 is amended to change instances of "Princeton Borough" and "Princeton Township" to "Princeton".
- (iv) Chapter 3.20 is amended to change instances of "handicapped" and "handicapped children" to "disabled" and "children with disabilities."
- C. In addition, the changes, amendments or revisions as set forth in Schedule A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, are made herewith, become effective upon the effective date of this Ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that upon adoption, a certified copy of this Ordinance shall be forwarded to the Office of the County Executive, County Counsel, County Administrator and Chief of Staff.

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WHEREAS, the Board of Chosen Freeholders of the County of Mercer, State of New Jersey, does hereby Ordain as follows:

- 1. The purpose of this Ordinance is to establish a Midblock Crosswalk where pedestrians may legally cross the roadway, said location being between two intersecting roadways more fully described and as set forth below.
- 2. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-8, which does confer upon Mercer County the right to establish certain regulations in the interest of safety and the expedition of traffic on roadways under Mercer County jurisdiction.
- 3. The location herein is designated as a Midblock Crosswalk.

Lawrence Station Road (CR 608) Township of Lawrence County of Mercer State of New Jersey

Location

Beginning at a point approximately 200' south of the centerline of Fountayne Boulevard and extending 10' southerly therefrom

4. Regulatory and Warning signs shall be erected and maintained to effect the above designated Midblock Crosswalk in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED, that the Clerk to the Board shall forward one (1) certified copy of said Ordinance to the office of the Lawrence Township Clerk, two (2) certified copies of said Ordinance to the Office of the County Engineer, and a copy to the Office of the Deputy Administrator, Department Transportation and Infrastructure.
