Executive Orders 177 and 179

- Signed by Governor Philip D. Murphy
- Mandates that every registered voter be mailed a vote-by-mail ballot in anticipation of the General Election on November 3
- Allows for a limited number of polling places to remain open for voters who prefer to vote on a provisional ballot

Mercer County Electoral Agencies

- Mercer County Clerk's Office
 - Receives petitions for all offices of municipal clerks, except those filed with the Attorney General
 - Designs and prints all election ballots
 - Draws lots for ballot position
 - Prints and furnishes vote-by-mail ballots, emergency ballots and provisional ballots
 - Approves or rejects vote-by-mail ballot applications
 - Prepares list of vote-by-mail ballot applications

Mercer County Electoral Agencies

- Mercer County Board of Elections
 - Selects polling places
 - Enforces Elderly Handicapped Accessibility Act
 - Creates and maintains election districts
 - Appoints challengers
 - Appoints and trains board workers
 - Receives, counts, investigates and certifies vote-by-mail ballots
 - Counts and certifies provisional ballots
 - Serves as Board of County Canvassers

Mercer County Electoral Agencies

- Mercer County Superintendent of Elections
 - Acts as the County's Commissioner of Registration, which includes regulating voter registrations; accepting voter registration applications; reviewing registration records to assure continued eligibility; and investigating provisional ballots
 - Acts as custodian of the County's voting machines

How to Return Your Mail-In Ballot

- Mail it in
 - Must be postmarked by Election Day and received by the Board of Elections no later than seven days after the Election
- Drop it off at your polling place on Election Day
 - Polls will be open from 6am to 8pm
 - Voters will be notified of their polling place via a postcard in the mail
- Drop it off at the Board of Elections, 1440 Parkside Ave, Ewing, by 8pm on Election Day
- Drop it off at one of the 15 secure drop boxes throughout the County

Drop Boxes

- All drop boxes will be open by October 5
- Voters can place their ballot in any drop box in Mercer County, regardless of residency
- Drop boxes are monitored and ballots are routinely collected by board workers
- Boxes will close at 8pm SHARP on November 3
- Four drop boxes are located in Trenton

Important Deadlines

- October 5: All mail-in ballots will be sent out
- October 13: Final day to register to vote
- October 28: Extended hours for vote-by-mail pickup; open until 7:30pm; Trenton office only
- October 31: Extended hours for vote-by-mail ballot pickup (walk-in); 9am to 1pm; Trenton office only

- November 3: General Election Day; polls open at 6am and close at 8pm; ballots can be dropped off at drop boxes or at your polling location until 8pm
