MERCER COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SPECIAL FORMAL MEETING

APRIL 30, 2021 VIA ZOOM VIDEO CONFERENCING

Chair Frisby called the Special Formal Meeting to order at 6:00 PM

Chair Frisby announced that the purpose of this Special Formal Meeting was for the Board to take action on the following public hearing and proposed Resolution:

2021 MERCER COUNTY BUDGET

Chair Frisby announced the reconvening of the Public Hearing on the 2021 Mercer County Budget of the County of Mercer, New Jersey;

Chair Frisby asked if there were any questions or comments.

Ms. Debra Baseman, requested that her questions be read into the record by Chair Frisby. (See Schedule A, attached hereto made a part hereof)

Mr. David Miller, discussed the Introduction of the Amendments and explained that his request included two particularly large items requested by the Board of Elections (BOE). He said one of the items was the purchase of 500 electronic poll books and the purchase of a new machine. Mr. Miller explained that these additions were discussed at the last Commissioner meeting and were reflected in the Amendments.

Commissioner Walter was hopeful that the BOE understood the importance of this expenditure and that any leftover funds should be utilized to help train the employees on the new machine. Commissioner Walter was extremely interested to see how the new machine would assist in the BOE's daily operations.

Mr. Miller was hopeful that this new machine would be an asset to the BOE moving forward.

Commissioner Melker asked if this expenditure was in the capital budget.

Mr. Miller concurred.

Commissioner Koontz asked if this department was exceeding the CAP limit.

Mr. Miller explained that the CAP is recognized only on salary and wages not on office expenses.

Commissioner Walter asked which electronic poll books the BOE planned on purchasing.

Lillian Nazzaro, Esq., County Administrator, explained that there are four different companies the BOE is currently looking at to purchase the books. She informed the Board that they would have an opportunity to see the machines this month.

At this time, Chair Frisby invited the members of the public to comment on any item listed on the agenda.

Judy Hoechner, 1406 Shiloh Road, Yardley PA, addressed the Board. She spoke asked about the 21.7 million in funding the Trenton-Mercer Airport had allotted for and asked what projects were going to be completed with this funding.

Mr. Miller suggested that Ms. Hoechner fill out an OPRA request for that information.

Ms. Hoechner also was interested in the process of liquidating debt on the terminal. She said if this would occur within the next five years.

Mr. Miller replied that the Administration had plans on continuing with the addition of the terminal and that it was a future endeavor of the County.

Mr. Glen Reitmeier, 1124 South Houston Road, addressed the Board. He wanted to state for the record that the public should not have to file OPRA requests for this information and that it should be provided to them.

Commissioner Koontz explained that numerous constituents ask for information and that filling out an OPRA request is a transparent and useful tool to help them receive the information they are looking for.

A Motion to Adjourn the Special Formal Meeting was offered by Commissioner Koontz, seconded by Commissioner Cannon, which motion was adopted by the unanimous vote of the members of the Board.

Commissioners, Mr. Miller & Ms. Montgomery,

I am hopeful that you can answer the following budget questions in advance of the meeting Friday. I have included screenshots so as to avoid any confusion as to what I am asking.

With regard to Sheet 13d:

For both 2020 & 2021, Airport Salaries and wages are approximately \$2 million (\$1.9 & \$2.2mill respectively) whereas "other expenses" are in the \$4 million range.

Last year when I asked at the budget meeting what the other expenses were, the answer was "things come up". My microphone was muted by the Chair so I could not ask more details.

Please elucidate what the \$4million in other expenses is anticipated to be spent on and what it was actually spent on in 2020.

With regard to Sheet 13d and FAA Financial Report 127

County sheet 13d lists \$2 million in Salaries and Wages for 2020

FAA financial report 127, Lists Personnel Compensation and Benefits (line 6.1) as over \$8 million in 2020.

This discrepancy in numbers holds true for 2019 numbers and anticipated county 2021 budget.

The same FAA report lists the airport as having only 23 full time employees in both 2019 & 2020.

Can you please provide details of this \$6mill discrepancy?

With Regard to Sheet 29b

Please specify what projects, and the approximate cost of each project, that will be funded with the \$32 million earmarked for the airport.

With Regard to FAA Financial Report 127

Grant Receipts (\$3 to \$4 million) are counted as Income (line 8.3)

County contribution (Line 4.8) was \$6.9 Million in 2020 and \$3.6 Million in 2019

These cash infusions seem to cushion the operating expenses of the airport and make it appear more profitable than it actually is.

Collections from Passenger Facility Charges were <\$2 million during 2019, a peak travel year for TTN.

Yet according to county budget sheet 29b, you are planning on infusing nearly \$32 Million dollars into the airport in 2020: under \$9 million of this is FAA grants. \$1.1 million is from Taxpayer funds and the other \$22 million are from county bonds.

County administrator, Lillian Nazzaro, has previously confirmed that shortfalls in bond repayment would be absorbed by Mercer County Taxpayers.

With Regard to Sheet 22

Mercer will pay \$29 million this year to service our current County Debt.

Given the massive additional debt planned for 2021-2024 airport expansion, please estimate the amount that will be spent in bond debt in each of the next 3 years.

I am trying to understand why we would acquire additional debt at this particular time, when air travel is down, tax revenue and state appropriations are likely to be decreased and many Mercer residents are desperately struggling.

I hope that Mr. Miller and Ms. Montgomery can provide specific details to these questions for both the community and the Commissioners prior to the vote on Friday.

I urge the commissioners to take a hard, honest look at the airport expansion and the potential risks, both financially and environmentally, to the community.
