Resolution to Recommend Approval of Proposed Amendment to the Mercer County Water Quality Management Plan titled "Conover Fields Comfort Station" in order to amend the Stony Brook Regional Sewerage Authority River Road Treatment Facility's Sewer Service Area to include a portion of Block 24.14, Lot 24.01 in West Windsor Township

WHEREAS, the Mercer County Planning Board has been petitioned by ACT Engineers, Inc., on behalf of landowner West Windsor Township, to amend the Mercer County Water Quality Management Plan (WQMP) to include the lands described below in the Stony Brook Regional Sewerage Authority [SBRSA] River Road Treatment Facility's sewer service area (SSA); and

WHEREAS, ACT Engineers, Inc., representing West Windsor Township, prepared an amendment to the Mercer County WQMP titled "Conover Fields Comfort Station" seeking to add 0.045 acres to the SBRSA River Road SSA to accommodate the construction of a comfort station located at an outdoor recreational facility in West Windsor Township, Mercer County, on a portion of Block 24.14, Lot 24.01; and

WHEREAS, Block 24.14, Lot 24.01 is located in the southern portion of West Windsor Township northeast of the intersection of Conover Road and South Post Road, within a zone proscribed by the West Windsor Township Zoning Code as Rural Residential/Conservation (R-1/C); and

WHEREAS, the projected wastewater flow of the project is 3,720 gallons per day, to be conveyed to the SBRSA River Road treatment facility; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and the applicant arranged for a public notice to be published in the New Jersey Register on March 7, 2022, and the Trenton Times and Princeton Packet newspapers on March 8, 2022, and March 4, 2022, respectively, advising of a public hearing and seeking public comment concerning the proposed amendment to the Mercer County Water Quality Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held by the Mercer County Planning Board on April 13, 2022 concerning the amendment; and

WHEREAS, a verbatim transcript of the hearing was forwarded to the NJDEP; and

WHEREAS, the period for public commentary came to a close on April 28, 2022; and

WHEREAS, neither the NJDEP nor the Mercer County Planning Board received any public commentary during the aforementioned period; and


WHEREAS, as required by both NJ DEP and Mercer County procedures, the applicant sent letters requesting resolutions of consent with this proposed amendment to the West Windsor Township municipal government, and the Stony Brook Regional Sewerage Authority; which were received by these entities on March 1, 2022, and February 28, 2022, respectively; and

WHEREAS, both West Windsor Township and the SBRSA forwarded resolutions of consent to the Mercer County Planning Board within the required 60-day response time, approving of this amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board has found the proposed amendment and sewer service area designation to be consistent with county and local policies for the delineation of sewer service areas; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board recognizes the need to amend the Mercer County Water Quality Management Plan to provide for consistency with the proposed amendment and modification;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mercer County Planning Board endorses to the County Executive for his consideration an amendment to the Mercer County Water Quality Management Plan titled "Conover Fields Comfort Station."
