Hamilton Grant request for purchase of the Hamilton YMCA Sawmill Day Camp

The Hamilton YMCA, due to financial reasons, desires to sell the Sawmill property. Hamilton Township proposes to buy it and will lease it back to the Y to continue their progrms. The County holds the easement and it is restricted for outdoor recreation and day camp. The County had looked at purchasing the land but decided that it wasn't in the County's best interests. In exchange for County assistance the County will get additional land for the Crosswicks Greenway and shared parking.

B. Discussion on Special Occasion Events (SOE) on preserved farmland

Ms. Mager questioned how county preserved farmland will be affected by the proposed SOE Legislation. Ms. Walsh explained that preserved farms, like a winery, may have events such as weddings. This legislation addresses event space on preserved farmland. Ms. Mager explained that she understood that the legislation would allow preserved farms 15% of the land be available for SOE and up to 26 events per year. Ms. Floyd responded that she is concerned that it would be administered by the County that has over 90 farms. It is being perceived as a way to help the farmers. The SADC is also looking at new soil protection standards retroactive to all farms, also to be administered by the County.
