EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The Executive Director provided the following update on the Park Commission's operations during the closure under the Governor's Executive Order.

Since the official closure of County Offices on March 17th:

- Our *Park Rangers* have been fully operational and an invaluable asset in providing security to all of our Park Commission facilities and properties; as well as assisting the Office of Emergency Management at the Quakerbridge Mall COVID-19 testing site.
- The Howell Farm, Mercer Stables, and the Wildlife Center facilities continue to provide comprehensive daily care for the horses housed at our stables, the livestock housed on our farm and for the emergency care services of injured wildlife. Management and staff for these facilities continue to report to work daily and perform their regular duties.
- Additionally, the *Howell Farm* is actively assisting the community through donations to local food banks and pantries to help those in need during the public health emergency. To date, the farm has provided food pantries with 150 pounds of its wheat flour, 200 pounds of cornmeal, 275 pounds of oatmeal and 150 dozen eggs. The farm is has also provided yarn spun from wool sheared the farm's sheep to volunteer knitters; who are making hats, mittens, socks and scarves for donation to those in need of clothing items.
- Mercer County Park, Mercer Meadows, and our Golf Courses, have had work crews of six (6) employees working five (5) days per week performing the essential maintenance functions necessary to protect and preserve the investment in our infrastructure.
- Oversight of our *Critical Capital Projects Under Contract* has continued, with our project managers and contracted consulting firms working with contractors to monitoring progress both in-person and remotely.
- And finally, our *Personnel manager, Chief of Finance and Accounts and Facility Coordinators*, have continued to report to three (3) times per week to ensure that payroll needs are met, to keep utility payments current for our operational facilities and to oversee and maintain the necessary procurement functions that provide our facilities with the supplies needed for continued equine, livestock and wildlife care; as well as infrastructure maintenance.

The Executive Director commented: "I am extremely proud and grateful for my team for their tremendous efforts and continued commitment to our constituents."
