OLD BUSINESS:

Executive Director Award Recognition-Deputy Director, Joe Pizza reported to the Board that Executive Director, Aaron T. Watson received an award from the National Recreation and Parks Association Organization; nominated by Ms. Elenore Horne, Executive Director of the Lawrence-Hopewell Trail, for his contributions to the Mercer County Park Commission during his current tenure. Executive Director, Aaron T. Watson thanked the Park Commission staff, management, his administrative team, the Board and the County Executive for the support.

<u>Current Operations During Covid Closure under the Governor's current Executive</u> Order

- Golf Staff has been working five (5) days per week, under social distancing guidelines to continue to provide golf services to patrons.
- Maintenance staff has been working five (5) days per week, under social distancing guidelines, to maintain grounds; including mowing, seeding and tree work.
- Wildlife Center, Stables and Howell Farm Staff have been working five (5) days per week, under social distancing guidelines, to continue to provide animal care and facility maintenance.
- Administrative staff have been staggered in the office to maintain payroll, invoice reconciliation and contractual payments; as well as correspondence and Executive staff support.
- Trade Staff has been working five (5) days per week for any facility repairs and /or upgrades needed; as well as create PPE Plexi-glass shields for facilities and offices under the current guidelines.

<u>Mercer Meadows Paving and Drainage Project</u>-This project is currently eighty-percent (80%) complete and anticipated to be completed in the coming month.

<u>Stony Brook Pedestrian Bridge and Trail Project-</u>This project is nearing substantial completion. There will be a ribbon-cutting scheduled within the coming month.

Re-Paving of Walking Trails and Paths in the Mercer County Park and Tennis Center Complex-This project has been completed.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Executive Director Aaron T. Watson provided the Commission with an update on operations through the first phases of re-opening under the Governor's Executive Order:

- Golf-Some restrictions on golf play have been lifted. Foursomes are now permitted, as well as the utilization of driving ranges, putting greens and golf cart rentals.
- Tennis- Tennis play has resumed, with restrictions.
- **Dog Parks**-All Dog Parks have re-opened, under the posted guidelines.
- Mercer Stables-Riding lessons have resumed, with restrictions.
- Marina-Boat rentals have resumed at the Marina, with restrictions.
- Camping in the East Picnic Area-Reservations for campsite use in the East Picnic Area will open on May 29, under the posted guidelines.
- Virtual Programming-The Environmental Education Department and the Howell Farm will be moving forward with offering a series of virtual summer camp programs to replace traditional camp offerings, still under restriction.
- Bike Share-The Executive Director reported that unfortunately, due to the COVID Crisis, Zagster, Inc. has informed the Park Commission that they are no longer viable as a company and cannot complete their contract effective immediately. The Park Commission Administration will work in the coming months to move forward with a similar program that will be the most advantageous option for the public.
