- C-1: 2020-21 Deer Management Report:

- Our deer management report for the 2020-21 season is completed and has been provided for your review.
- This year, a total of 361 deer were harvested over a total of 3,977 acres within our park system.
- o The harvest goals for both Baldpate and Mercer Meadows were met and exceeded.
- o 77 deer were donated, bringing our total venison donation to 285 deer or 42,180 servings since beginning the donation program.
- O We are very excited to learn that our deer population inside of the Mercer County Park has dropped to 32 deer per square mile. In 2018, the population was at 70 deer per square mile.

Park Commission Capital Projects:

- o Paving Project in the Mercer County Park (Rink area and walking trails)-This project has been completed.
- Sewer upgrade at the West Pump Station (Mercer County Park)-This project is ongoing, and completion is anticipated in the coming weeks.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (Presented by Executive Director, Aaron T. Watson)

Update on Governor's Executive Order:

- INDOOR MASKS: The Governor is removing the statewide indoor mask mandate effective May 28th. Businesses and entities overseeing indoor spaces may continue requiring individuals to wear a face mask. The Governor is strongly encouraging unvaccinated individuals to continue wearing a face mask in any indoor public setting.
- SOCIAL DISTANCING: The Governor is removing the requirement that individuals maintain
 six feet of social distancing in indoor and outdoor settings effective May 28th. Businesses may
 continue requiring individuals to maintain six feet of social distancing.
- DANCE FLOORS, BARS, AND RESTAURANTS: The Governor is removing all prohibitions from dance floors and bars and restaurants and from ordering food and drinks while standing at bars and restaurants; effective May 28th.
- **INDOOR GATHERINGS**: The Governor is removing all capacity restrictions on indoor gatherings; effective June 4th.
- NJ Recreation and Parks Association award for Stony Brook Pedestrian Bridge Project-This month, the Park Commission, Planning Department and engineering firm, Engineering & Land Planning received an award from the NJRPA for excellence in design for the Stony Brook Bridge. The bridge provides an important final connection to the Lawrence Hopewell Trail (LHT) in Mercer Meadows.

- Capital City Farm:

- O Trenton City Council officially approved the management agreement assigning management of Capital City Farm to the Park Commission.
- Farming under PC Manager Logan Davis is now underway, soon with the assistance of one (1) seasonal laborer.
- The Strawbale Garden is already producing lettuce, kale, spinach, parsley, cilantro, scallions and green garlic for the Trenton Area Soup Kitchen (TASK).
- o CCF will host a "Meet & Greet" event for partners and supporters of the Strawbale Garden on May 27 from 6:00-8:00 pm.

- Moores Station Quarry Master Plan:

- The third public meeting in the Moores Station Quarry Master Plan process took place on May 19. A draft plan was presented for public review and input.
- The Robbinsville, Ewing, Trenton and Hopewell Valley school districts participated in a Zoom meeting with Simone Collins to share students' ideas for the Moores Station Quarry Master Plan.
- Miry Run Ponds (DS21)- A final schematic design and summary of permitting requirements for Phase I improvements is due from the Contracted Consultant, Van Note Harvey Associates, in June.

- **Trenton Fishing Wharf-** Contracted Consulting firm, Stantec has developed a park concept plan for the Trenton Fishing Wharf to complement and enhance the flood control project to be constructed at the site by NJDOT.

- Openings:

- o Marina-Opened on May 24 [Weekends only from Memorial Day to June 15.
- o **Splash Park-**Opened on May 24 [Weekends only from Memorial Day to June 15; and then will be open Tuesday thru Sunday (closed Mondays) from June 15 through Labor Day].

GOLF OPERATIONS:

- Golf continues to have record numbers of participation; this month's numbers were 4,000 participants. We have also had our county high schools using our courses for practice and matches.

TENNIS OPERATIONS:

- **Summer League-**Over 662 players have registered to date.
- **2021 Summer Junior Tennis Camp-**Registration is on-going. Over 246 spots have been sold.
- **Tennis/Pickleball** -Over 1,146 Tennis and Pickleball ID cards have been sold since January 1, 2021.
- Indoor Seasonal Courts-Registration for 2021-22 Indoor Seasonal Courts is on-going. Over ninety-six 96 courts have been sold to date.

RECREATION AND EVENTS:

- **Bike Share Program with Verve S-**We are currently coordinating with Verve S for delivery of bikes to the Park Commission within the coming weeks.

MARKETING AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH:

- Juneteenth Celebration Activities—A variety of events and activities are being planned for the
 upcoming Juneteenth celebration. The Mercer Stables Juneteenth event will include a riding
 demonstration by the Crazy Faith Riders, and historical information about Black cowboys; which
 is currently being researched and written by the Outdoor Equity Alliance.
- Baldpate Nature Camp Thanks to scholarship donations raised to support our diversity and inclusion efforts, the Center for Child and Family Achievement (CFFA) will send five (5) of their rising seventh-grade students to Baldpate Nature Camp in July.
- Swim-to-Row Program The Park Commission assisted the Capital Area Y with transportation for Swim-to-Row students this month. Students who participated in this month's program learned swimming stroke techniques.

STEWARDSHIP:

- Ash Loss/ Reforestation Efforts Sourland Conservancy interns have begun planting select trees
 and shrubs in the forest adjacent to the Summit Trail and Ridge Trail at Baldpate to fill canopy gaps
 created by dying ash trees.
- Rosedale Lake Harmful Algal Bloom Grant: Our project partner, the Watershed Institute, deployed 1,000 sq. ft. of constructed floating wetlands in Rosedale Lake this past Friday as part of the measures being taken to control Harmful Algal Blooms in the waterbody.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

- Baldpate Summer Camp:
 - O Camp capacity has increased to ten (10) per session due to improving COVID restrictions.
 - We have added a camp program in July that will serve children entering grades 7-9.
 - o Advertisement for additional camp openings has been sent through County email blast.
- **Stormwater Walk-**We held our first ever Stormwater Walk at the nature center. Attendance was very positive, with interest shown by adults and children alike.

HOWELL FARM:

- **Recent Public Programs-**Our "Corn Planting" program had an attendance of 257 visitors; bringing 2021 overall Saturday Farm attendance to over 6,612.

MERCER COUNTY STABLES:

New Initiatives:

- Power Tools for Living Program
 — Oaks Integrated Care Mercer House was the first organization to commit to the program; the Center for Child and Family Achievement provided a subsequent commitment to the program.
- **Summer programs** This summer, Mercer Stables will offer lessons, adaptive riding, and a menu of day–programs. On-line registration will open on June 1.

- **Interns**-New volunteer summer college interns continue to arrive at the Wildlife Center. For twelve (12) weeks, there will be eighteen (18) total scheduled interns.
- The Spring season has arrived with an influx of young animals, including: Common Raccoons, Eastern Screech Owls, and Mallards.
- Outdoor Education Environment-Self-guided tours are seeing significant foot traffic. Hours of operation are now: Wednesday-Sunday; from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm.
