C-1 ***Mercer County Spreads Cheer With Annual Holiday Toy Drive***

Generous donations from both residents and County employees contributed to this year's successful Mercer County Holiday Toy Drive; which is coordinated by the Marine Corps, Toys for Tots Program and Mercer County Park Commission Ranger Staff. County Executive Hughes joined the Marine Corps and Park Commission staff for the pick-up of the toy collection at the Historic Hunt House.

C-2 ***Park Commission Develops Pollinator Habitats Throughout Mercer County***

Since 2017, in an effort to increase various pollinator species populations, the Park Commission has utilized various grant funding and Open Space Trust funding to lead an initiative to convert open spaces into meadows that are attractive to bees, birds and other pollinator species. Since the initiative began, the Park Commission has transformed eleven (11) areas, approximately fifty-seven (57) acres, into welcoming habitats for pollinators. Eight (8) additional meadows, totaling 77.4 acres, are currently progress.

Commissioner Mooij indicated that the pollinator program has brought significant added benefits to the stewardship of our parklands and open spaces. Additionally, the Commissioner indicated that the added social media publications highlighting this initiative are also beneficial.

➤ **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**

Presented by Executive Director, Aaron T. Watson

NEW INITIATIVES:

- **Trenton Fishing Wharf:**
 - o The City of Trenton's Planning Board hosted a public meeting on December 9, where the Park Commission and Consultants from Stantec presented a conceptual park plan and solicited feedback from the community.
 - o Known as the Old Wharf property, this city-owned site sustained major structural damage from flooding more than a decade ago, which made the park unsafe for public access. For years we have been looking for a way to address this problem. Thanks to a current partnership between the State, the County and the City of Trenton, we are excited to be advancing plans to restore and renew the Old Wharf Park.
- **Moore's Station Quarry** – With the Master Plan for Moore's Station Quarry now adopted, the Park Commission staff is working with Trap Rock Industries on the development of a reclamation plan, which will outline Trap Rock's responsibilities for closure and reclamation of the site before it is handed back to the County for management in 2023.
- **Rutgers Center for Urban Environment and Sustainability (CUES) Parks Assessment Report** - Rutgers CUES has completed and submitted their Mercer County Parks Inventory and Analysis report for our review. A final executive summary is also being prepared, with an overview of the analysis and recommendations for each of our park facilities. Once finalized, a digital copy will be shared with the Commissioners and will also be posted to the Park Commission's website for public viewing.

GOLF OPERATIONS

- Our annual Gift card Black Friday Sale ended on November 30, Gift Card sales from all three (3) of our Pro Shops netted \$500k. This eclipsed last year's mark of \$400k;
- Overall golf revenue for 2021 is at \$5.5 Million, with a few more weeks to go golf revenue could top \$6 million for the year, an all-time record;
- Overall golf participation numbers exceeded expectations with 166,673 rounds played (all courses) through November 2021. Total rounds played in 2020 was 127,269; total rounds played in 2019 was 124,137;
- We are forecasting to add approximately 25,000 rounds with the addition of Hopewell Valley Golf Course in 2022.

TENNIS OPERATIONS

- Being determined a safe and socially distant sport, Tennis/Pickleball membership exceeded expectations, increasing by 25.7% in 2021. There are currently 1,368 ID Card holders;
- Despite a slow start to the 2021 indoor program participation, interest peaked by the summertime. The Summer Tennis Camp sold out for the first time in years, selling 282 spots and generating \$32,960 in revenue;
- Overall Tennis Revenue for 2021 currently stands at \$722,071.16. Revenue is currently even with 2019's pre-pandemic revenue.

MARKETING AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- This year, we restarted Swim to Row program with two (2) small classes to allow for social distancing;
- In order to continue our partnership under COVID guidelines, we held three (3), well-received, on-line interactive career panels for our Isles Youth Institute students;
- After a grab-and-go River Days Event in 2020, we held a traditional River Days event in 2021, offering canoeing in the South Riverwalk pond. The offering was so well received that we will continue with canoeing in the pond for future events;
- We held our first bike drive for the Trenton Bike Exchange, which was the most successful in the Bike Exchange's history, according to the organization's president. Donors were able to drop off bikes at the nature center, Hunt House Barn, or Mercer County Park. Approximately 400 bikes were donated;
- A new marketing initiative this year included signage placed on County Roadways and properties to promote free concerts and movie nights.

RECREATION & EVENTS

- Bike Repair Stations Installation – This year, Bike repair stations are currently being installed at seven (7) locations throughout our parks; including:
 - o Hunt House
 - o Rosedale Park
 - o Pole Farm (Red barn)
 - o Reed Bryan Farm
 - o MCP Marina
 - o MCP West Picnic Area
 - o MCP East Picnic Area

- Overall, 2021 Revenue is approaching \$360K, which is more than revenue totals seen from 2020 and 2019;
- For 2022, revenue totals from previous year are anticipated to be exceeded, with the return of some of our long-standing events, proposed regattas and a full year of athletic field usage.

STEWARDSHIP

- **2021 Restoration Projects:**
 - o 3,500 native plants were planted throughout Mercer County to reduce pollution in waterways, create habitat for wildlife, sequester carbon, provide clean air, and beautify parks;
 - o 40 acres of lawn converted to meadow for the benefit of threatened pollinators and wildlife;
 - o 20 acres of native habitat protected from deer browse;
 - o 260 acres of prescribed burning to aid in forest regeneration and invasive species management.
- **2021 Invasive Species:**
 - o 41 populations of nonnative invasive species were treated/eradicated;
 - o 300 circle traps created and donated by an aspiring eagle scout; were distributed to Mercer County residents to combat Spotted Lanternfly.
- **New Initiatives in 2021-**This year, the Stewardship team developed an Invasive Species Detection and Treatment app using Field Maps, a mobile app available through ArcGIS Online to track invasive species populations and treatment. This approach is more efficient and takes advantage of technology that is available for improving fieldwork.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

- **Public Programs-**This year, the Environmental Education Department hosted 244 public programs, attracting over 1,750 participants to our parks.
- **Summer Camp Scholarship-**A long time goal of the Environmental Education Department was achieved this year when eight (8) children were able to attend Baldpate Nature Camp free of charge, thanks to the sponsorship by the Centers for Child and Family Achievement.
- **Launched the Youth Environmental Leaders Program -**Seeking to engage youth in environmentally focused careers, this program will provide high school aged children with hands-on outdoor activities, career exploration & readiness training, and awareness of environmental issues.

HOWELL FARM

- **Share the Harvest Program-**Howell Farm and Capital City Farm together donated 21 tons of fresh produce, flour and other products to local food banks and pantries this year. Through related programs for the public and schools, thousands of community members helped grow and harvest the crops while learning about sustainable farming, nutrition and food security.
- Howell Farm attendance returned to 70% of pre-pandemic levels for public programs; 50% for school groups;
- Corn Maze attendance exceeded last year's all-time high. All-new pre-school programs were filled to capacity and additional sessions had to be added.

CAPITAL CITY URBAN FARM (CCF)

- In its first year of public operation, Capital City Farm provided educational programs and tours to more than 2,000 people, many from East Trenton neighborhoods and local schools.

MERCER COUNTY STABLES

- This year, the Stables facility benefitted from several major Capital improvements, including a complete renovation of the facility's offices, restrooms, the addition of a meeting space and a large viewing window to allow for public viewing of the riding ring during programming and lessons;
- Months before being declared a State and Federal holiday, the Park Commission worked with two county non-profits to host a Juneteenth celebration featuring Black cowboys and other equestrians. Nearly 400 people were in attendance, making it one of the best events ever held at the Stables.

WILDLIFE CENTER

- New patient count from January 1st to December 15th of 2021 is **2794**
- New patient count from January 1st to December 15th of 2020 is **2677**
- During 2021, our goal was to continue to remain open 365 days a year to provide County residents with a resource for their wildlife questions and concerns. We were able to accomplish this goal with approximately 1/5 of our normal volunteers in place. In mid-October we went back to a normal schedule for staff disbanding our team model utilized during COVID Closures under the Governor's Executive Order.
