- C-1 Resident Letter sent to recognize Park Naturalist, Christina Athmejvar for leading the, "Just a Hike Program".
- C-2 On April 10, the Mercer County Park Commission and the Mercer County Planning Department worked together to organize a Bike Drive to benefit the Boys and Girls Clubs of Mercer County. The collaborative effort yielded a collection of over 400 bikes; which is the largest and most successful collection in the initiative's 12-Year history.
- C-3 The Mercer County Park Commission has approved a prescribed burn plan to be implemented by the New Jersey Forest Fire Service (NJFFS) at Baldpate Mountain. The Forest Fire Service has worked in collaboration with the Park Commission's Stewardship Department in recent months to develop the plan, which is tailored to improve the ecological condition of the Park Commission-managed natural area.

Commissioner Smith asked if the report will also a look at Municipal Parks.

Superintendent Cucchi responded that the current deliverables will not be looking at individual Municipal Park needs; but that a more in-depth survey to address these needs would be a future consideration.

Commissioner Smith asked that once identified, the administration bring the item addressing these needs to a future agenda meeting for consideration; in the interest of assessing how the Park Commission may provide municipal assistance and shared services.

Commissioner Caton supported Commissioner Smith's inquiry and indicated that a Strategic Planning approach will be beneficial to identify needed improvements and programs.

Commissioner Davis asked the Superintendent to speak to the Community Engagement portion of this Contract.

Superintendent Cucchi indicated that at this time, the inventory and mapwork will be performed under this Contract as phase 1, and as we move forward, a separate scope of work inclusive of community engagement initiatives will be formed.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Presented by Executive Director Aaron T. Watson

Governor's Executive Order Changes:

- The size limit on outdoor gatherings in New Jersey will increase from 200 to 500 people in two (2) weeks. This will allow for increased picnic area rentals, as well as additional outdoor events in our parks.
- Indoor catered events— such as weddings and proms will be able to operate at 50% capacity with a maximum of 250 people. This will give our caterers the opportunity to begin booking more indoor events.

NEW INITIATIVES:

- Moores Station Quarry Park Master Plan Landscape Architecture firm Simone Collins has completed stakeholder meetings with a variety of interest groups gathering feedback on potential re-use ideas for the Quarry. The Steering Committee met on April 27 to review a draft master plan to be presented at the public meeting scheduled for May 18.
- Miry Run Ponds At Miry Run Ponds, engineers have a pre-permitting meeting with the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) on April 29 to review permitting requirements for Phase I park improvements. Princeton Hydro has completed soil sediment sampling in the lake and preliminary results indicate no concerns regarding the feasibility of dredging portions of the lake and re-using dredge spoils on site.
- **Trenton Fishing Wharf** Park Commission staff and contracted Consulting firm, Stantec have developed conceptual plans highlighting options for park improvements at the Trenton Fishing Wharf. We are also working with NJDOT in order to ensure that a flood control project at the site will complement future park improvements.

- **Splash Park-**Opens on May 24 [Weekends only from Memorial Day to June 15; and then will be open Tuesday thru Sunday (closed Mondays) from June 15 through Labor Day].

GOLF OPERATIONS

- Mercer Oaks Team matches finished their second week on April 25, 2021.
- Princeton Country Club was busy with the start of the Senior and Ladies leagues, along with group lessons instructed by the Golf Academy Staff.
- The First Tee of Greater Trenton has continued their programing at Mountain View and Mercer Oaks.

TENNIS OPERATIONS:

- Grover Middle School, Robbinsville High School, Mercer County Community College and Special Olympics, are currently utilizing the courts for play.
- The Metro Atlantic Athletic College Championships are being held April 24th through 25th. Four (4) men's teams and four (4) women's teams will be competing.
- Registration for 2021-22 Indoor Seasonal Courts is on-going. So far, over ninety-one (91) courts have been sold.
- 2021 Summer Junior Tennis Camp registration is on-going. Over 172 spots have been sold.

RECREATION AND EVENTS:

- Bike Share Program with Verve S:
 - o Verve S was sent their finalized Contract on April 23, 2021.
 - o Equipment is anticipated for delivery in early May.
- Juneteenth Weekend via with the African-American Cultural Collaborative of Mercer County – Discussions are underway to explore the Park Commission's possible Co-Sponsorship of a series of Juneteenth events with the African American Cultural Collaborative and the Outdoor Equity Alliance. An external meeting with event planning partners took place on April 21; with the next planning meeting scheduled for May 12.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH:

Moores Station Quarry Park Student Input – The Robbinsville, Ewing, Trenton and Hopewell Valley school districts plan to participate in a May 20 Zoom meeting with Simone Collins to share students' ideas for the Moores Station Quarry Master Plan.

STEWARDSHIP:

- **Prescribed Burn at Baldpate Mountain** The New Jersey Forest Fire Service completed a partial prescribed burn at Baldpate, on April 20. The park was partially opened on Thursday, April 22 and fully open on Friday, April 23.
- Deer Management-On April 21, Director of Stewardship, Jenn Rogers presented at Duke's Deer Farm's Deer Management for Forest Restoration and Carbon Sequestration presentation; there were 171 attendees.
- Tree Plantings Tree plantings throughout the parks took place during Earth Week last week. Approximately 1,300 plants were installed throughout Rosedale Park, Roebling Park, and Dam Site 21. Volunteer groups included Lexus, Starbucks, Robbinsville High School and the Peddie School.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

- **Lenape Programs** Our first presentation in this new series went well. Through a Zoom format, 70 students learned about Lenape history and culture in the Trenton area. The school would like to come for a field trip to Roebling Park next year.
- Summer Camp scholarships As part of our equity and diversity efforts, we have secured donations to provide scholarships to six summer campers for our nature camp this summer at Baldpate. The Sourland Conservancy is now engaged in efforts to get lunches donated for the six (6) scholarship students that we will be hosting this year.
- **Eyes on Eagles** We officially have triplets at our Bald Eagle nest at Mercer Lake. Our first of two (2) virtual Eyes on Eagles programs begin on April 29; with over 166 attendees currently registered to-date. In-person nest viewings will conclude on May 2.

HOWELL FARM:

- Juneteenth Celebration:
 - During a special "Pleasant Valley House Tours" program scheduled for Juneteenth, Saturday, June 19, the Howell farm will feature stories of black families who lived in; or who were enslaved in, what is now called the Pleasant Valley Rural Historic District.

The farm is providing its homegrown and processed cornmeal to community partners who are including cooking and other food related activities in their Juneteenth programming. The cornmeal was made from the farm's 2020 corn crop which was raised with historical methods; picked with the help of school groups and the general public, and milled at the Thompson Neely House & Mill in Washington's Crossing, PA.

- Recent Public Program: "Spring Plowing and Wash Day"

- o The program had an attendance of 280 visitors; bringing 2021 overall Saturday Farm attendance to 5,288.
- O Participants had opportunities to watch and photograph as farmers plowed the field where corn will soon be planted. In the market garden, visitors helped plant potatoes, and in the barnyard they learned about the pre-cursor to the modern washing machine the hand-cranked washer

MERCER COUNTY STABLES

- **Power Tools for Living Zoom Presentation**- A presentation about Equine Assisted Therapies called, "Power Tools for Living" took place on Friday, April 23. Thirteen (13) interested organizations participated in the presentation.

- Trail riding:

- o The season ends May 16; The program will start back up again in September.
- o Trail riding spots are offered 6 days per week-, all days except on Fridays.
- Over 97 participants have registered for 118 Trail Rides to-date in 2021.

WILDLIFE CENTER

- Juvenile Bald Eagle Release:
 - With the assistance of New Jersey Fish and Wildlife ENSP volunteer nest watcher, Mr. Kevin Buynie, a juvenile bald eagle was found in a field, not flying, and was subsequently admitted to our care on April 19.
 - o Blood tests were run for lead levels and cholinesterase levels. Both levels were elevated but were not found to toxic.
 - o Following the tests, treatment was administered by staff.
 - Once he was healthy, he was carefully measured and fitted with state and federal identification bands and was successfully released back into the wild. Overall, another successful bald eagle rescue.
