 Rogers began her employment with the Park Commission in November of 2008 as our Naturalist and became Director of Stewardship in 2019.

> VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION

(Presented by Executive Director, Aaron T. Watson; Nominated by Howell Farm Director, Pete Watson)

- Long-time student volunteer Evan Miller completed his Eagle Scout project at Howell Living History Farm on September 25th of this year. The project was to improve the farm's entrance area by building sections of historical snake fence either side of the entry gates, restoring the hedgerow affected by ash borer losses; along with providing new entrance signage. The project involved 383 hours of volunteer time, \$1,784 in donated materials, and the management of 39 scouts and scout parents.
- Due to COVID-related delays and material shortages, the project took 23 months to complete, presenting Evan with challenges well over and above those normally encountered by Eagle Scouts. Undeterred, he patiently and carefully advanced each of the project's objectives by working closely with the farm's management, fellow Scouts, and with volunteers.

> EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

NEW INITIATIVES

- Capital City Urban Farm:
 - A Pizza Garden is being established at Capital City Farm and will be the focus of educational programs about urban farming; one of which is about the history and present-day popularity of Trenton's famous *tomato pies*. Garlic and winter wheat is planted and looking good.
 - o Initial improvements for future programming are underway. An open- air pavilion is scheduled to be installed by in-house forces in the coming month.
- Dam Site 21 Princeton Hydro and Van Note Harvey Associates are advancing the next phase of permitting and design for park improvements and dredging portions of the lake. Geotechnical testing at the site will be scheduled next by the consultant team.

GOLF OPERATIONS

- This month, golf courses continued to host successful late-fall outings and events:
 - o Mercer Oaks held the successful Lawrence Knights of Columbus Outing. This outing helped raise \$9,000 for the organization's charities.
 - o Golf courses held the last Major Amateur Event at Mercer Oaks West, East, and Mountain View. Over sixty (60) Seniors participated in the late fall event.

TENNIS OPERATIONS

 In addition to our main tennis facility in the Mercer County Park we opened our Platform Tennis courts at HVGC this month. The har-tru courts at Hopewell will remain open for another few weeks.

RECREATION AND EVENTS

- "Light the Night" The Leukemia and Lymphoma held their "Light the Night" walkathon and fireworks event in the Mercer County Park on October 30.
- Lacrosse and Soccer Showcases -This month, the park hosted multiple Lacrosse showcases and a Soccer College Showcase.

MARKETING AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- **Bike Drive** – The date of April 9, 2022 has been identified for the Boys & Girls Club Bike Exchange. In addition to the Nature Center, Mercer County Park and the Hunt House Barn, we will add a new location along Valley Road for the 2022 event.

STEWARDSHIP

- **Urban Stewardship** This month, Stewardship staff hosted two (2) workshop sessions at the annual Watershed Institute conference. The topic for the sessions was "Vacant Lot Restoration" and had sixty (60) participants.
- Roebling Park Restoration -As part of the on-going marshland restoration efforts at Roebling Park, the Stewardship team installed 300 marsh plants in areas that have been cleared of invasive Phragmites.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

 Youth Leader Program – The Environmental Youth Leaders program continues to meet on a weekly basis. Most recently, these high school program participants performed a marsh clean-up at Roebling Park.

HOWELL FARM

- **2021 Corn Maze** This year's Corn Maze attracted over 6,250 visitors.
- Share the Harvest Operations and Programs Fall harvest operations have increased food bank contributions of vegetables, grain products, and eggs to over 29,600 pounds since March 26 of this year. When combined with the 7,400 pounds of vegetables grown and donated by Capital City Farm, the 2021 Park Commission total is now at approximately 18.5 tons.

MERCER COUNTY STABLES

- Trail Riding- The Stables received a tremendous response from recent marketing efforts.
 Due to the demand, Saturday trail riding was added, making trail riding available to the public seven (7) days per week.
- Special Olympic Riders- Mercer Stables recently hosted the Special Olympics New Jersey
 Area 11 Local Program. Our riders did very well, with many earning a medal. Ribbons
 and medals were presented via virtually on November 4th.

WILDLIFE CENTER

- Wildlife Center Director and key staff recently completed an on-line Raptor Training Certification course provided by the University of Minnesota.
