- C-1: SAVE THE DATE: MERCER COUNTY TENNIS HALL OF FAME DINNER: Rescheduled from 2020, the Park Commission will host the Tennis Hall of Fame Dinner on June 10, at the Boathouse at Mercer Lake to honor the Tennis Hall of Fame Class of 2020
- C-2: MERCER COUNTY BIKE DRIVE: Hosted as a collaborative community outreach effort by the Mercer County Planning Department, Mercer County Park Commission and the Boys and Girls Clubs of Mercer County; a bike drive will be held on April 9 at various locations within the Park Commission.
- C-3: MERCER COUNTY PARKS INVENTORY AND ANALYSIS REPORT: Last May, the Park Commission entered into a Service Agreement with Rutgers University's Center for Urban Environmental Sustainability (CUES) to complete an inventory and analysis of Mercer County's Parks and facilities; for the purpose of establishing baseline data on current Park attributes and natural resources; along with future recommendations to maximize the benefits of our park system. > EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

2022 NEW INITIATIVES:

- Miry Run Ponds (Dam Site 21)

Designs for park improvements and dredging are progressing. A meeting was recently held with the operator of a pipeline that crosses the property to discuss dredging and park plans. Planning is also underway to amend the sewer service area to accommodate plans for restrooms in the park. The Park project will also be presented for courtesy review to local planning boards on March 16 (Robbinsville) and March 23 (West Windsor).

- Trenton Fishing Wharf

NJDOT has prepared a draft agreement to memorialize their commitment to build park improvements provided that the County provide all necessary funding. The agreement is currently under review by Park Commission counsel.

Moores Station Quarry

A revised reclamation plan for quarry closure has been prepared by Trap Rock Industries and is under staff and legal review. The Final Master Plan report is expected from Simone Collins in March.

GOLF OPERATIONS

- The 2022 season is off to a good start. Weather has allowed the courses to open periodically; with the courses generating approximately \$111,000.00 in revenue.
- Currently, 400 residents have updated their membership cards so far.
- On March 1, all four (4) golf courses will open for play, weather permitting.

TENNIS OPERATIONS

- On Saturday, February 12, online registration was held for March-August Tennis Lesson Programs. One-Thousand, One-hundred and Twenty-one spots (1,121) were filled generating \$84,220.00 in revenue.
- Administrative staff have been involved with numerous winter projects; including development of a new online reservation system, as well as an online league scoring system.

MARKETING AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- Swim to Row

Students from Sprout University and the Center for Child and Family Achievement are in Level 2 of the program, continuing with swimming lessons at the Hamilton Y, one (1) day per week. Rowing lessons will begin at the PNRA in early March.

- Career Fairs:

- Staff attended a career fair at Hopewell Valley Regional High School on February 16 with summer job and internship descriptions from the Stables, Golf Courses, the Nature Center, and Howell Farm.
- The Park Commission is looking into future participation in the school's cooperative education program.

RECREATION & EVENTS

2022 Concert Series

A schedule for the 2022 Concert series is being finalized; pending the final selection of the National Act component of the series. A contract is currently under review between the Contracted Entertainment procurement services provider, Ultra Artists, the Park Commission and the entertainer, Morris Day, to perform at the Mercer County Park Festival Grounds.

STEWARDSHIP

- Living Shoreline at Roebling Park:

- This project will include creek bank stabilization, a new boat ramp, and the preservation of in-situ archaeological artifacts. Final project designs by consultant Princeton Hydro, have been developed and sent to the NJDEP for a pre-permit application review.
- This project is being supported in part by a \$150,000 Green Acres grant, in addition to a \$150,000 grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION

Youth Leader Program:

- The initial Youth Environmental Leadership program has been extremely successful in providing youth participants with a myriad of tools to promote environmental education and leadership within a professional environment.
- Many of the initial youth participants have expressed interest in continuing their efforts with the Park Commission in an internship or seasonal capacity.
- Staff are currently working with the Watershed Institute to consider how to continue and expand the program next year.

HOWELL FARM

- **Howell Farm In the News:** This month's Farm programming was featured on the following news outlets:

- Visitation Increases:

- O Weekday school programs are either at capacity, or almost full for spring programs.
- O Public program attendance on weekends has returned to pre-COVID levels and for many programs has increased.

- Isles Community Gardens Plowing:

- O For the 37th year, on Tuesday, April 5, Howell Farm will bring a team of plow horses to the Chestnut Street Community Garden in Trenton.
- Our team will work with neighborhood gardeners, school children and Isles staff members as they ready a half-acre garden for planting.

CAPITAL CITY URBAN FARM (CCF)

- Washing and Packing Shed

Consultant, Pickell Architecture is preparing plans and drawings needed to begin construction of a shed that will be used for washing and packing produce, as well as providing shade for educational programs.

- Science Mentor Program

This month, the farm provided a tour and program for "Science Mentors" - a school group interested in agricultural science and engineering.

MERCER STABLES

Juneteenth 2022 Event Planning

Preliminary brainstorming discussions are taking place for our 2022 Juneteenth event. Formal planning meetings will be scheduled in the coming weeks.

WILDLIFE CENTER

- New patients through February 12 = 79; patients recorded at the same time period in 2021 = 70
- In an effort to rebuild our volunteer base, new volunteer orientations are planned for April 2 and 10. These will be the first volunteer training orientations held since 2019, pre-pandemic.
- Recruitment of college interns at the Wildlife Venter continues. Outreach has included contacting local universities and colleges regarding paid and unpaid opportunities.
