INFORMAL MEETING OF OCTOBER 11, 2022

MINUTES

Commissioner Board Chair Melker called the Agenda Meeting to order at 6:01 P.M. on October 11, 2022, in Room 211 of the Joyce L. McDade Administration Building, 640 South Broad Street, Trenton, New Jersey.

ROLL CALL

The following members of the Board answered the Roll Call of the Clerk to the Board:

Present – Commissioners Cimino, Frisby, McLaughlin, Koontz, Melker, Stokes and Walter

Chair Melker led the Pledge of Allegiance and Salute to the Flag.

SUNSHINE LAW

The Clerk to the Board announced that in accordance with the provisions of the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law, notice of this Informal Meeting had been mailed to The Trenton Times, The Trentonian and The Princeton Packet newspapers as well as having been posted in both the County Administration Building and Courthouse at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the meeting.

COMMUNICATIONS

Four (4) communications were discussed and approved for placement on the Agenda for the Formal Meeting of October 13, 2022.

RESOLUTIONS

Thirty-nine (39) proposed Resolutions were discussed and approved for placement on the agenda for the Formal Meeting of October 13, 2022.

Commissioner Cimino made reference to the following proposed Resolution authorizing to execute a Shared Services Agreement with Ewing Township for the provision of Municipal Alliance Programming and Coordination for Drug and Alcohol Prevention and Education through the Division of Mental Health and Addiction Services (DMHAS) Youth Leadership Grant. Commissioner Cimino discussed the recent tragedy that caused significant fire damage to the Ewing Senior and Community Center. He commented that multiple towns have reached out since the tragic event offering ways to assist those affected by the fire. Commissioner Cimino asked what the towns could do to help assist with providing services.

County Administrator, Lillian Nazzaro, Esq., explained that originally, she thought the nutrition site was located at the ESCC but it was not. She said she spoke with Bob Hartmann, Supervisor of Emergency Management and he has been extremely helpful in assisting residents as well as Human Services Director, Marygrace Billek.

Commissioner Walter said she was also aware that neighboring communities have offered to assist Ewing seniors with necessary services. She was also concerned with parking on election day because the ESCC was utilized but the Board of Elections decided against using this location.

Commissioner Walter made reference to the following proposed Resolution authorizing to execute a Professional Service Contract with the Firm of Genova Burns, LLC to represent Mercer County and Mercer County Executive, Brian M. Hughes, Et Al.. Commissioner Walter requested Paul Adezio, Esq., County Counsel, provide the Board with the total amount expended on all cases dealing with former Park Commission Executive Director, Kevin Bannon.

County Counsel Adezio said he would provide that information to the Board at their next Commissioner meeting.

Commissioner Walter made reference to the following proposed Resolution authorizing to execute a Professional Services Agreement with Urban Engineers, Inc., to provide Engineering Design for Replacement Terminal (Phase II) Design Development, Construction Design, and Bidding Support at the Trenton-Mercer airport. She asked the Administration to provide the Board with a list containing every contract with Urban Engineers over the past two years.

Commissioner Cimino requested the Administration provide the same list for the firm of C&S Engineers as well.

County Administrator Nazzaro said she would get that information to the Board.

The Commissioner Board discussed the following proposed Resolution urging Governor Murphy and Legislators to expedite a solution to the recent State Health Benefits Commission decision to increase State Health Benefits by 22.8 percent. The Commissioner Board collectively felt an urgency to send a Resolution to the Governor and Legislative body to take action on the proposed health benefit increase. Commissioner Frisby asked the Administration to take a look into how the County could lessen the financial burden on its employees.

County Administrator Nazzaro responded that the Administration was looking into all available options.

County Administrator Nazzaro informed the Commissioner Board that the Administration reached a settlement with the public defenders' office and asked the Board to add a Resolution for Thursday.

The Board agreed to add the following proposed Resolution to the Agenda, which authorizes a Consent Settlement Agreement regarding certain litigation; Krakora, et. Al. v. County of Mercer, Et Al.; Morris County (NJ) Superior Court, Docket No. MRS-L-2489-19.

County Administrator Nazzaro explained that there are flashing lights during school hours and when the lights are flashing the speed limit is 30 MPH. She noted this would lower the speed limit to 25 MPH.

Commissioner Frisby stated this had been an on-going issue and Hopewell did not send a support Resolution in support of this change.

Commissioner Walter stated that before she could approve this Ordinance Adoption she would like to get further clarification on this matter.

County Administrator Nazzaro said this decision was based on traffic studies and deemed appropriate.

The Commissioner Board collectively agreed to remove this Ordinance Adoption from the Agenda and wait for responses from the Administration. The agreed to consider the Ordinance at another time.

OLD BUSINESS

Commissioner Koontz discussed a Resolution which the Board adopted at the last set of Commissioner meetings. He mentioned the Resolution authorized payment to various 1st aid Rescue Squads throughout Mercer County. He spoke of a recent discussion he had with Princeton Mayor, Mark Freda and how the Mayor said that their 1st aid squad did not receive the funding this year. Commissioner Koontz questioned the Administration and how they choose to fund the rescue squads.

County Administrator Nazzaro replied that if a rescue squad get paid they are not eligible to receive the funding.

The Commissioner Board discussed this matter further and felt that the funding should be provided to all of the voluntary rescue squads especially because of the services they provide the community. They collectively decided to draft a Resolution including squads that were paid in the past and provide them with funding. The Board felt strongly about this matter and were going to fund this project going forward.

NEW BUSINESS

Commissioner Walter discussed a proposed Resolution she wanted to have draft for the next meeting. She spoke about our local farmers and how many of them are struggling across the State of New Jersey. Commissioner Walter noted there are advertisements all over Mercer County to buy "Jersey Fresh", but she would like to propose a Resolution suggesting the same. Commissioner Walter wanted to send the Resolution to area supermarkets and to Mercer County agencies that purchase locally grown food.

The Commissioner Board was in support of the Resolution.
