
PRINCETON AT A GLANCE

GEOGRAPHY AND HISTORY

Princeton is 18.1 square miles and comprises the former Princeton Borough and Princeton Township, which consolidated on January 1, 2013. In 1697, early settlers Richard and Susannah Stockton acquired 5,500 acres from William Penn. Nassau Street, Princeton's main street, was once a Native American trail which later became the King's Highway in Colonial days. After the American Revolution, Nassau Hall was temporarily used as the U.S. Capitol. Today, downtown Princeton boasts numerous retail shops surrounded by historic residential neighborhoods and is one of the most affluent communities in New Jersey. Note: 2010 data is an aggregate of Princeton Borough and Princeton Township.
