Commissioner Mooij stated that the Hopewell Valley Pool has been a good addition to our offerings and operations and management have been responsive to patrons.

Chair Forrester asked if tennis ID cards are available for the Hopewell Valley Golf Course Facility.

Executive Director Watson indicated that ID cards are available for the Hopewell Valley Golf Course Facility.

Commissioner Forrester asked if the Park Commission currently offers any services to make golf membership affordable to members of the public who require financial assistance.

Executive Director Watson replied that Park Commission currently maintains 6,000 memberships.

Commissioner Schulz replied that a universal card would provide greater ease of access. Additionally, Commissioner Schulz commended the current youth golf program and thanked golf staff and the Executive Director for providing this offering in the golf portfolio.

All results were clear and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection provided approval correspondence for use.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT (Presented by Executive Director, Aaron T. Watson)

Executive Director Watson reorganized Facility Coordinator, Ms. Jill Hogan, who will be retiring at the end of the month after over 40 years of service.

Executive Director Watson formally introduced and recognized Dr. Sharon Sharp, Temporary CFO for the County of Mercer, who joined in attendance for the Park Commission's Annual Meeting.

Executive Director Watson announced that two (2) new Board Members for the Park Commission have been appointed to the Board and will be sworn in the coming weeks.

GOLF OPERATIONS:

- Golf outings are in full swing at all courses. Two (2) of the larger outings for the year, Capital Health and NJ State Police, will be held at Mercer Oaks this week.
- We have received complements from outside organizations about the condition of the courses.
 With the lack of rain, and now the very humid wet weather, our golf maintenance staff is doing a great job of keeping the courses in good condition.

TENNIS OPERATIONS:

- The USTA Middle States Open concluded on Monday night with eighty (80) of the best players in the Middle States Section competing.
- The Tim Donovan College Tennis Showcase is ongoing and has attracted 100 coaches from all over the United States. 160 players have travelled from all over the world including Hong Kong, Spain, and Hawaii to participate.

MARKETING AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH:

- Juneteenth Event at Capital City Farm:
 - o Approximately 300 people visited CCF for the Juneteenth event on June 10.
 - o A variety of activities were led by Park Commission staff and volunteers. Donated books were available to children for free at a literacy station.
 - o Complimentary food included hamburgers, hot dogs, barbecue chicken, potato salad, collard greens, peach cobbler, and red velvet cake.

- Juneteenth Event at the Festival Grounds in Mercer County Park in partnership with the American Cultural Collaborative:
 - o Between 1,500 and 2,000 people visited the Festival Grounds for the celebration on June 17.
 - o Everette Harp and Alex Bugnon headlined a host of great acts that entertained the crowds.
 - o This fun and free event was an unforgettable evening for every family member. Youth enjoyed face painting, arts and crafts and athletic activities.
 - o A host of local vendors and food trucks were available for all to enjoy.
 - o Over 300 cyclists participated in the, *Third Annual Juneteenth Freedom Day Ride*, which kicked off in Mercer County Park.

STEWARDSHIP DEPARTMENT:

- 200 shrubs were planted at Mercer County Park last week to enhance meadows along Paxson Avenue. Participating volunteer organizations included: NJ Watershed Ambassadors and ISLES Climate Corps.
- Regulations for the 2023-2024 Deer Management Season have been finalized and will be published shortly on the Park Commission website.
- Evidence of Harmful Algal Bloom (HAB) have recently been identified at Willow Pond and Rosedale Lake. "HAB Watch" and "HAB Advisory" signs have been posted.

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION:

- Free Fishing Day at Dam Site 21 - The, Free Fishing Day at Dam Site 21, on June 3 was filled to capacity and a great success. Twenty-eight (28) attendees tried their hand at fishing and many caught sunfish for the first time.

- Summer Camps:

- o The first week of summer camp began this week with the Aquatic Adventure Fishing Camp at the marina. Sixteen (16) children will learn about lake and fish ecology and practice their fishing skills with the help of staff and volunteers.
- The second week of the Fishing camp, Baldpate Nature camps, and Tulpehaking Nature Camp for 7-9-year-olds have reached capacity.
- Fall 2023 Program Series Partnership ISLES Climate Corps and Trenton High School are interested in registering for our Designing for a Green Future program series for Fall 2023. This new program offers career skills training in park design and green infrastructure for local high school students and young professionals, conducted in partnership with The Watershed Institute.

HOWELL FARM:

- **Trenton Area Stakeholders Meeting** - The Trenton Area Stakeholders held their quarterly networking meeting at the farm on Wednesday, June 7. Afterwards, they were treated to a tour of the farm's Revolutionary War period house and garden.

CAPITAL CITY URBAN FARM:

- Fruit and Vegetable Donations:
 - One hundred (100) pounds of kohlrabi, carrots, and peas were donated to the Trenton Area Soup Kitchen on June 19.
 - o Hand-picked cherries were also given out to members of the local community last week.

 Volunteerism – Members of the ISLES Climate Corps, as well as several new volunteers from the community, helped to weed gardens, transplant seedlings from the greenhouse, and install trellis lines for tomatoes.
