One Stop Staff Update

Update - Summer Youth Employment Program 2022

Final Report: [Kassia provided a PowerPoint presentation showcasing the youth's experiences]

- 338 Applicants; 1st year in which every municipality was represented the majority (58) from Trenton
- Our LOS was 110; 131 started & 109 completed the SYEP
- Of those youth with barriers most of them had an IEP
- 86 were returning to high school; 13 returned to college; A couple were beginning the YCC track
- 3 were hired by their summer internship employer; 2 were extended
- 50 Employer Partners; Overall great feedback from participating employers
- Biggest barrier this summer was the requirement of Covid-19 vaccinations required by some employers, which limited some offerings
- Top requested positions by youth was for camp aides and daycare workers
- Great weekly presentations during Friday sessions. Special Thanks to WDB members who offered their time



OSY Contracts

- One contract was renewed to Isles and will run through June 30, 2023
 - o They offer HSE instruction, job readiness and work experience

YCC Activities

Started last week with 6 youth; 1 was referred to Isles. Youth must meet low-income guidelines and have a barrier. Program sessions start on a monthly basis.

- Targets 18-24 youth who possess a high school diploma or equivalent; those that don't have are referred to Isles
- Program provides job readiness, financial literacy, presentation skills, counseling with goal of entering occupational training and/or obtaining employment
- Those that test below 9.0 reading/math levels are referred to the Workforce Learning Link to increase their CASA scores
- Paid internships are available
- The provision of a stipend while the youth is in training is being explored. It was suggested reaching out to reach out to private entities for funding
- YCC is available to make YCC presentations at community agencies

Job and Career Fair

- October 26th at the CURE Arena (3:30 p.m. 6:00 p.m.); many seasonal opportunities will be available
- We have at least 72 interested employers
- A career segment is being added to this event; Unions are being recruited
- Marketing flyers will be sent out this week
