Commissioner Koontz asked for additional background

Executive Director Watson stated that this Agreement will be the design Contract for Phase I Construction upgrades at the Trenton Thunder Ballpark. Funding for this design phase is through a County American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) federal grant.

Executive Director Watson stated that funds for construction and further design will be through a pending \$5M congressional earmark legislated by Assemblyman Verrilli.

Commissioner Koontz asked how many design and how many construction phases are planned

Deputy Director Pizza stated that there will be additional phases for both; which are in the planning process and are anticipated to have a total project cost at approximate \$25M.

Executive Director Watson stated that in order for the Lessee of the Stadium, Garden State Baseball, to engage a Major League Baseball team, the stadium bust be brought up to MLB standards.

Commissioner Forrester asked how often MLB standards change.

Commissioner Schulz stated that if changes are not updated, the facility will not be able to house a MLB-associated team.

Commissioner Koontz asked what the plan is proposing

Executive Director Watson stated that we are not in receipt of the proposal or estimate for larger phase of work from the Consultant.

Commissioner Schulz stated that the plan would include a complete overhaul of the field; which will require a large amount of funds.
