- WQMP Sewer Service Amendment Public Hearing: "Moore Residence at 106 Hopewell Rocky Hill Road"
 - The proposed amendment, identified as the "Moore Residence 106 Hopewell Rocky Hill Road," would expand the sewer service area (SSA) of the Stony Brook Regional Sewerage Authority (SBRSA) Hopewell Sewage Treatment Plant by 0.04 acres to serve an existing single-family home located on Block 8, Lot 66, in Hopewell Township, Mercer County. The home is currently served by an underperforming onsite system which will be abandoned and closed upon connection to the sewer. The project will generate a projected wastewater flow of 300 gallons per day (gpd) based on flow calculated in accordance with N.J.A.C. 7:14A-23.3.
- <u>Presentation on State's New Juvenile Justice Facility (Ewing Township)</u>:
 - The State of New Jersey is proposing a new facility for the New Jersey Juvenile Justice Commission. The development includes a single-story administration building, a single-story gymnasium, and three single-story residential structures.
 - Access to the site is proposed via Ashley Ave and Ester Ave which come out to Lower Ferry Road and Stuyvesant Ave respectively (both County Roads). Approximately 105 parking spaces are proposed for the development.
 - The project will add approximately 151,632 SF of new impervious surfaces to the site. Three underground infiltration basins are proposed to provide groundwater recharge, stormwater runoff quality and runoff quantity measures.
