BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this Resolution shall be sent to the Governor of the State of New Jersey, President of the New Jersey State Senate, the Speaker of the General Assembly, Mercer County Legislative Delegation, all Mercer County municipalities, New Jersey Military Installation Growth & Development Task Force, and the New Jersey Defense Enhancement Coalition, Boards of Chosen Freeholders of all counties in New Jersey, and the Office of Mercer County Counsel.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be distributed to the Boards of Chosen Freeholders of all of the other counties in the State of New Jersey, urging them to adopt similar resolutions of support.
