- Take this to the ICP - Ballot Marking Device and hand the Voting Authority to the Board Worker.

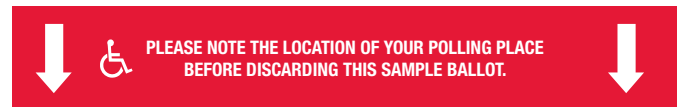
<p>1</p>  <p>The Board Worker will generate your district ballot to the touch screen.</p>	<p>5</p>  <p>Confirm your selection. Select 'Print' to print the ballot or 'Back to Ballot' to make changes.</p>
<p>2</p>  <p>Voter instructions appear, select 'Go to Ballot'.</p>	<p>6</p>  <p>Select 'Print your ballot' to print your completed ballot, WAIT FOR THE GREEN CHECKMARK, next take your ballot, to the ICP - Scanner.</p>
<p>3</p>  <p>Touch the screen to select your choices. To vote for any person whose name is not printed on this ballot, fill in the oval by the words "Write-In". Insert the name of the person for which you wish to vote on the blank line.</p>	<p>7</p>  <p>At the ICP - Scanner, feed the ballot into the tabulator entry slot.</p>
<p>4</p>  <p>When selection has been made, select 'Review'.</p>	<p>8</p>  <p>Watch the screen to the right, it will say 'Casting Ballot' followed by 'Ballot Cast'. The voting process is complete.</p>

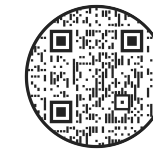

NON-PARTISAN MUNICIPAL ELECTION BALLOT

WEST WINDSOR TOWNSHIP PUBLIC QUESTION

Shall the municipal charter of the Township of West Windsor, governed by the nonpartisan Mayor-Council form of government under the Faulkner Act, be amended, as permitted under that plan, to provide for a change from nonpartisan to partisan municipal elections to be held in November?

INTERPRETIVE STATEMENT

The Township of West Windsor currently holds nonpartisan municipal elections in November, meaning that a candidate's party affiliation is not currently indicated on the ballot. Voting "Yes" to this question will allow for a change from nonpartisan candidates for municipal office to partisan candidates for office to appear on the ballot as either a nominee of a political party or as an independent. A "No" vote will result in the continuation of nonpartisan elections to be held in November.
