30 31 32 33 34 35 37 38 39	VI.	<ul> <li>CORRESPONDENCE</li> <li>Mr. Pace noted that the SADC sent several requests for comment, discussed later in the meeting, and published a newsletter for preserved farm owners.</li> <li>Hopewell Township is requesting that the CADB take action, perhaps in April, regarding a temporary condemnation of the former Martin Tract Preserved farm. This is required by the SADC because the Township is requesting to place a small and temporary concrete plant on the Premises. The plant is needed to manufacture concrete for the upcoming and nearby Honey Lake dam rehabilitation. The farm owner offered the use of his land. CADB members who also represent the Soil Conservation District may need to recuse themselves from this action because the SCD has been involved in this matter.</li> </ul>

- The SADC requested comments on a new Federal Agriculture Land Easement deed. Mr. Pace suggested that no comment was necessary because the Mercer CADB has not utilized Federal funds for over 10 years because the Feds imposed deed restrictions that the CADB felt were not compatible with agriculture in NJ. Board members still felt that way and even more so with this new deed.

- C. Status of Farmland Preservation Applications:

## 2016 PIG:

- Gaskill et al on Sawmill Road: As mentioned last month, the applicants are still moving forward slowly.
- McNulty farm in Hopewell: Survey work by Van-Note Harvey is moving slowly.

## 2018 PIG:

• Chowdhury: The owners have agreed verbally to sell in-fee to the County this 32-acre targeted farm on Sawmill Road in Hamilton. An Agreement was sent to them but has not been returned yet.

## IX. OLD BUSINESS

- Monitoring\Radvany Farm: A Civil Action Complaint was filed by County Counsel for the non-agricultural use (landscaper) to be terminated. Radvany negotiated an out-of-court agreement with the County which gives him 90 days to comply (May 18<sup>th</sup>) then a \$1000 fine for non-compliance every 30 days thereafter. Unannounced inspections are now permitted and new violations incur a \$5000 fine.
- PennEast pipeline: There have been no further revisions to the proposed route in Hopewell Township. PennEast formally filed with FERC in October 2015 and after numerous public hearings and meetings submitted a draft Environmental Impact Statement to FERC; but, FERC has thrice delayed action on accepting the EIS. The current date is April 7th.

## X. NEW BUSINESS

- Monitoring Schedule for March was distributed.
- Special Occasion Events on Farms: Board members discussed a February 8th memo from the SADC requesting comment by March 30<sup>th</sup> on special occasion events on preserved farm wineries pursuant to PL 2014, Chapter 16. That law allows, for 46 months, preserved wineries to host events that would not normally be allowed on the Premises under the Deed of Easement. Mercer County preserved farm wineries have extensive exception areas from the Premises and thus do not necessarily need to utilize the provisions of the law. The law "sunsets" in early 2018 and the SADC must report to the legislature on the results of the law.

Board members were uncertain whether the memo was asking for input on special occasion events on wineries as the legislation permits – at least till next year, or, on all farms. The memo also requested comment on RTF protection for special events on preserved farms. Here again there was uncertainty as to what was being asked. However, generally speaking, Board members felt that any special occasion event, weddings for example, should be permitted on preserved farms provided the event contributed to the marketing and sale of the farm's product. In addition, such events might be provided RTF protection; but, there was considerable discussion on RTF including whether or not an "occasional" event would need such protection - especially if the event required a municipal permit as is often the case.
